The “common interest” of mathematics in the last quarter of the nineteenth century contributed to the emergence of an American mathematical community. What “standards and traditions” evolved as mathematicians strengthened this community in the opening decades of the twentieth century? Using the private exchanges of Leonard Dickson and Oswald Veblen, this talk explores some of the issues and events that shaped this phase of growth in the American mathematical community.
