Using a variety of online documents and multimedia resources, we discuss how the history of mathematics can be made more meaningful and contextual. Integrating the wide array of material from outside the classroom can be daunting in a course that already has substantial content to cover. However, by realigning the course through mathematical themes and contexts, we were able to integrate the abundance of online material ranging from art history to original documents to video broadcasts about the history of mathematics. Through the use of online resources, we will see how a history of mathematics course can achieve a certain depth that would not be possible in a traditional lecture and textbook classroom.
