Preliminary report.

Al-Kāshī (also known as Jamshīd Kāshānī) discussed the calculation of sine of one degree in his non-extant treatise *Risāla al-watar wa'l jaib* ("The Treatise on the Chord and Sine"). Our discussion in this paper will be based on *Sharh-i Zaīj-i Ulugh Beg* ("Commentaries on the Zaīj-i Ulugh Beg"), by Nizām al-Dīn 'Abd al-'Alī ibn Muhammad ibn Husain al-Bīrjandī (d. 1528). In Chapter II of Book II of the above *Zaīj*, Bīrjandī commented on Kāshānī's aforementioned treatise, and he presented the calculation of sine of one degree based on Kāshānī's iterative method from *Risāla al-watar wa'l jaib*.
